

CLASS INSTRUCTIONS FOR SOLID MAPLE

Main Card

1. Cut ivory linen to 11" x 4 ½" and score it down the center of the 11" side and fold.
2. Make two more folds in the opposite direction ½" on either side of the first crease. Glue together the ½" sections between the creases.
3. Punch a hole ½" down on both the top and bottom edges of the glued area and string a black ribbon through and tie it in a bow on the front of the folded card.

Front

1. Stamp **142P Winter Tree** three times in black ink at the bottom of 3 ½" x 3 ½" ivory linen.
2. Mount this onto 3 5/8" x 3 5/8" galvanized cardstock and then onto 3 ¾" x 3 ¾" black linen.
3. Attach this onto the front of the card using foam tape.
4. Emboss **237J From the Heart** in white onto 3" x 1 7/8" galvanized cardstock.
5. Mount this onto 3 1/8" x 2" red confetti and attach it in the top-left corner of the Winter Tree piece.
6. Colour **1043L Solid Maple** in various shades of red and brown Tombow markers, sprits it with water and then stamp it onto ivory linen.
7. Add a dot of 85-crystal glitter to the center of the leaf.
8. Cut the maple leaf out and mount it in the lower-right corner of the Winter Tree piece using silicone glue.

Inside

1. Randomly stamp 8" x 3 ½" red confetti with Winter Tree three times in black ink and three times over that in white ink.
2. Mount this onto 8 1/8" x 3 5/8" black linen and glue it onto the inside of the main card.
3. Emboss **1049F Curly Best Wishes** in white on 1" x 2 ¾" galvanized cardstock.
4. Mount this onto 1 1/8" x 2 7/8" red confetti and then onto 1 ¼" x 3" black linen and mount it in the top-right corner of the card.
5. Colour Solid Maple in various shades of grey and black Tombow markers and sprits with water and stamp it onto ivory linen. Repeat this two more times.
6. Stamp **666F Maple Leaf** twice in the same way as above.
7. Add a dot of 85-crystal glitter to the center of each leaf and cut each leaf out.
8. Attach all the leaves randomly over the Winter Tree piece using silicone glue, being careful to avoid gluing over the crease.
